### FIFTH IN OUR SERIES OF IRISH PATRIOTS - EASTER 1916



Eamonn Ceantt: Sept 21, 1881 - May 8, 1916

Eamonn Ceannt was born in County Galway, the son of a Royal Irish Constabulary officer. When his father was transferred to Dublin, Eamon was educated at the local National School and later at the Christian Brother School on N. Richmond St. Post-graduation he worked as accountant in the Treasury Dept. of Dublin Corporation. He was impressed (some say `radicalized\_) after attending commemorations of the 1798 United Irishmen Rising and especially the Battle of Ballinamuck that marked the defeat of the French allies during the 1798 Rebellion.

He joined the Gaelic League in 1899, taught Irish to newcomers, and became a member of its governing body. A talented musician and uileann piper, he founded the Dublin Pipers Club and joined Sinn Fein in 1907 and was recruited into Irish Republican Brotherhood (IRB) by Seán MacDiarmada. He moved up the ranks to be a member of the IRB Supreme Council and its Military Committee. After taking part in the 1914 Howth gun running episode, Ceannt was a charter member of the Irish Volunteers and elected to Provisional Committee of Irish Volunteers. In 1913 he was a Captain in Company A, 4th Battalion.

Ceannt was described as a very tall man and enjoyed playing the pipes. He was a sincere and good person, rather fanatical, but really one of the nicest and best people in the movement. In 1908 he led Irish athletes to Rome for the jubilee of Pius X. In a private audience he played the uileann pipes for his Holiness.

During the Rising of 1916, Ceannt, signatory to Easter Rising Proclamation, held the rank of commandant in command of the South Dublin Union and Marrowbone Road Distillery outposts of the Volunteers. It is told that during the fighting there he remained calm, brave and gentle. His unit inflicted heavy losses on British officers and men before the South Dublin Union was over run.

The British imprisoned Ceannt at Kilmainham Gaol where he was sentenced to death. Between 3.45 and 4.05AM on 8 May 1916, Eamonn Ceannt was taken to Stonebreakers Yard and executed by firing squad. His last words were: 'I bear no illwill towards those against whom I have fought. I have found the common soldiers officers human and higher and companionable, even the English who were actually in the fight against us. Thank God soldiering for Ireland has opened my heart and made me see poor humanity where I expected to see only scorn and reproach\_. His remains were later buried in Arbour Lane Cemetery. His widow founded the White Cross to help families impoverished by British actions.

Mike McCormick's book <u>The Road to Rebellion</u> is an excellent, illustrated chronicle of the reasons for the Easter Rising, the events of the six-day battle, and profiles of the 16 executed patriots.
