NEWS FROM THE VAAOH STATE MEETING

The **March for Life** is on Friday, January 22. Hibernians are asked to attend 9AM at St. Mary Mother of God Church (727 East 5th Street NW). Breakfast is immediately following Mass. This is a **sash and medallion** event. The church and the Irish Channel pub are located between the Gallery Place-Chinatown & Judiciary Square metro stops for those taking the metro. No need for a head count, but \$25 is the cost of the breakfast and cash is appreciated.

On April 23, 2016, the **AOH National Board Mass** commemorating the Easter Rising will be celebrated at St Patrick Catherdral, New York City. A reception *(invitation only)* will follow at the Irish Consulate in NYC. The Hilton Hotel in Pearl River (20 miles north of midtown) is offering Hibernians a special room rate. Buses will transport attendees to/from Mass

Several VAAOH divisions are planning significant activities commemerating the Easter Rising 1916. See the division reports located in the restricted area of the state website.

2016 AOH National Covention will be held at Harrods in Atlantic City, NJ - 11-14 July.

Father Corby Division has embarked on and Irish Book Discussion Group. About sixty interested men and women meet in a local Irish pub once each month. The **2015 Hibernian of the Year** awardee is Kevin Cassidy, Past President, St Patrick Division, Virginia Beach. In 2015, Brother Cassidy lived our Hibernian values. He increased division membership, recruited a division chaplain, took a courageous stand in support of Hibernian values when he withdrew from the 2015 Virginia Beach St Patrick Day parade protesting the selection of a grand marshal who publically supports gay marriage and abortion. His stand generated wide spread support among Catholic clergy and Catholics throughout the region.

St Columcille Award was presented to Mike Creegan, Father Mychal Judge OFM Division, Triangle, VA. Mike has served the VAAOH for 16 years as division president in two divisions, as Prince William County president, and on he VAAOH State Board as webmaster.

Re-uniting General Meagher and Father Corby at the Battle of Fredericksburg Commemoration, December 13, 2015

On beautiful Sunday afternoon, Fredericksburg commemorated Irish Brigade losses in the Battle of Fredericksburg. National Park Service historian Frank O'Reilly presented a stunning account of how General Thomas Francis Meagher inspired his Irish Brigade in the face of near certain death. How he adored his soldiers with green sprigs of boxwood to remind them of their heritage and their future in America. The Irish assaulted the dug-in Confederate positions behind the stone wall. Father William Corby later said it was "a body of about 4,000 Catholic men marching – most of them – to death _.

Two Virginia AOH Divisions, General Thomas F. Meagher Division (Fredericksburg) and Father Corby Division (Fairfax) joined the National Park Service and the 28th Massachusetts Infantry Regiment re-enactors in the annual ceremonies at the Fredericksburg city dock, where the brigade crossed the Rappahannock River, and at Mary's Heights.

FOURTH IN OUR SERIES OF IRISH PATRIOTS - EASTER 1916

Edward 'Ned_ Daly 25 February 1891 - 4 May 1916



Edward 'Ned_ Daly was born into a large and proud Fenian family on February 25, 1891. He was the only son among the ten children born to Edward and Catherine Daly). His father was a Fenian; his sister, Kathleen, married Tom Clarke, an active member of the Irish Republican Brotherhood. His uncle, John Daly, participated in the Fenian Rising on 1867 and remained active in the IRB. They instilled Irish Republicanism in him. When he was a young boy, he wanted to be a soldier, but his family would never allow him to join the English Army. He was educated by the

Presentation Sisters, the Congregation of Christian Brothers, and at Leamy's commercial college. He spent a short time as an apprentice baker in Glasgow, before returning to Limerick to work in a timber yard. He later moved to Dublin where he worked as a wholesale chemist.

Although Ned's sister, her husband, Tom Clarke, and his Uncle Joe instilled Irish Republicanism in Ned, it is unclear when exactly Ned joined the Irish Republican Brotherhood. But in November 1913 he joined the newly founded Irish Volunteers. He studied military manuals and gained the admiration of senior officers in actions such as the Howth gun-running of 1914. He became a brilliant strategist and fighter, and his ties to a few of the leaders and his legendary bloodline helped him fast-track into command. Ned was the youngest person ever to be given the rank of

Commandant and his men followed his orders, despite his youth.

On the day that the Easter Rising of 1916 began, Ned addressed his men somberly: 'I have to tell you men, that you will shortly be going into action. At 12 o clock today, the flag of the Irish Republic is to be raised now I don't want any cheering and I also want to make it clear that if anyone wants to withdraw now, then he is at liberty to do so._ Only one man left and the rest, known as the First Battalion, marched into the battle. They covered the northwest area of Dublin, where some of the heaviest fighting was to take place in the Four Courts area of the central Dublin. He split his 250 men into smaller, more mobile groups that were strategically placed to give each other cover and aid when necessary. His battalion was one of the first to see action during the Rising. He captured 24 loyalists, including English Col J.P. Brereton. Though he was in the midst of a fierce battle, Ned made sure that his prisoners and the civilians in the area were always cared for. Daly was also captured Linenhall Barracks, which gave him an excellent field advantage. However, an onslaught of English forces caused him to retrograde. Ned set fire to the barracks.

When the order came from Padraig Pearse to surrender, Ned and his men were exhausted, hungry and stretched to their breaking point, but talked of ignoring the order. Daly took charge and made sure that the surrender was orderly and professional. He surrendered his battalion on 29 April and was executed by firing squad on 4 May 1916. At the age of 25, he was the youngest to be executed. A priest who was at Kilmainham Gaol before Ned was executed said `I remember well seeing Commandant Daly coming down from the prison cell. He was calm and brave as when he was with his men in Church Street Area. He was killed on the same day as Joseph Plunkett, Willie Pearse and Michael Hanrahan.
