
















2017 Ballyshaner's Irish Festival in Alexandria

Depart Dulles on United 126 nonstop to Dublin at 10:25pm

MONDAY, SEPT 25th - DUBLIN ARRIVAL & KILBEGGAN DISTILLERY

Cead Mile Failte -Welcome to Ireland. After claiming your luggage and passing through Irish customs your Caddie Tours driver/guide will escort you to your coach. We'll have a full Irish breakfast at the Coachman's Inn near the Airport. Drive to the center of the country to visit the Kilbeggan Distillery Experience, established in 1757, making it the world's oldest. See how whiskey is distilled on modern equipment in the old buildings and enjoy a sample of the finished product. Continue on to the tribal city of Galway. Galway, one of the most youthful cities of Europe, is full of craic. It boasts many street performers, bookstores, pubs, cafes and nightlife. Check into your hotel and enjoy free time for independent activities and discover some of the excellent restaurants and fun pubs.

OVERNIGHT: SALTHILL HOTEL, GALWAY (B)

TUESDAY, SEPT 26th - ARAN ISLANDS

Take a short ferry ride across Galway Bay from Rossaveal to Inis Mor, the largest of the three Aran Islands. These rocky islands are renowned for the hardy islanders who maintain traditional fishing and farming methods and where the popular intricately patterned fishermen's sweaters originated. The Irish language is still spoken widely amongst islanders today. These islands are divided up into tiny fields by stone walls but farming is difficult as the winds tend to carry away the soil. Take a minibus ride to Dun Aengus, a huge pre-historic fortress perched on sheer cliffs, which fall away to the Atlantic Ocean below. Return to Kilronan, the main town, for a casual lunch and have a look around on your own before returning to the mainland by ferry. This evening, join your fellow travelers for dinner in the hotel restaurant.







WEDNESDAY, SEPT 27th - CLIFFS OF MOHER & KILLARNEY Travel south around Galway Bay and pass through the solitary beauty of the Burren - a craggy bed of limestone dotted with tiny plants and flowers that thrive in the mild winters. We'll see megalithic tombs, ringforts, souterrains, cairns, holy wells and stone rows. On the coast view the Cliffs of Moher, which rise almost 700 feet above the pounding Atlantic surf. Drive south to take a ferry across the River Shannon Estuary and head to Killarney. Killarney was a monastic settlement from the 5th or 6th century. Explore colorful laneways and a fine cathedral and experience the ambience of busy streets in the town center. Nestled amidst deep, lake filled valleys with astounding sights such as Ladies' View and the Macgillcuddy Reeks - Ireland's largest mountain range. Check in to your hotel in the center of the town and enjoy dinner with the group in the Garden room restaurant. Discover some of the excellent fun pubs around town for Irish traditional music.

OVERNIGHT: THE MALTON, KILLARNEY (B, D)

THURSDAY, SEPT 28th - THE RING OF KERRY & TRADITIONAL IRISH NIGHT

After breakfast drive on a scenic tour around the Ring of Kerry. Visit the Skellig Experience Centre where you can experience many aspects of those offshore Skellig islands while remaining on the dry land, in a custom built, stone clad, grass roofed, prize winning building located right on the waterfront. Back in Killarney we'll head to Kate Kearney's cottage for an Irish Night featuring a lively show with dinner.

OVERNIGHT: THE MALTON, KILLARNEY (B,D)

FRIDAY, SEPT 29th - BLARNEY CASTLE ROCK OF CASHEL & KILKENNY CASTLE

Drive through the mountains into richer farming country on the way to Blarney. Climb to the ramparts of Blarney Castle to kiss the famous stone or, if you don't feel like a climb, take a gentle walk through the lovely park lands and colorful gardens. Shop for Irish-made goods at the Blarney Woollen Mills before traveling north. Pause for photos at the stately Rock of Cashel, a limestone outcrop with picturesque ruins and continue to Kilkenny for the overnight. Enjoy free time for independent activities and discover some of the excellent restaurants and fun pubs. Visit Kilkenny Castle. It stands dramatically on a strategic height that commands a crossing on the River Nore and dominates the 'High Town' of Kilkenny City. Over the eight centuries of its existence, many additions and alterations have been made to the fabric of the building, making Kilkenny Castle today a complex structure of various architectural styles. The original Anglo-Norman stone castle was built for William Marshal, 4th Earl of Pembroke (c.1146-1219) during the first decade of the thirteenth century. Kilkenny Castle later became the principal Irish residence of the powerful Butler family for almost 600 years.

SATURDAY, SEPT 30th - DUBLIN CITY & THE BRAZEN HEAD After breakfast depart for Dublin and explore the city and the sites such as Trinity College (which hosts the Books of Kells), Dublin Castle and Kilmainham Jail just a few to mention. Enjoy the afternoon in Dublin before we end the day by attending an enchanting evening of Irish folklore and storytelling while enjoying a candlelit traditional Irish dinner in The Brazen Head.

The tour has come to its final day. Transfer to Dublin Airport in good time to check in for your United flight 127 departing at 12:25pm for Washington Dulles. You may do some last minute shopping at the duty free stores before boarding your aircraft and flying across the Atlantic Ocean back to the United States and will clear US Immigration and Customs in Dublin and arrive in the US as a cleared flight.



AOH Jackets, Shirts, Sashes and Name Badges
