Whenever I visit Ireland, I always go to Kilbrittain, Co Cork. It reminds me of the time I first visited the village with my grandmother in 1989 when she showed me her home and then around the village. Now when I go, I always knock on the door of the house next to where my grandmother was raised. This is the old Jack Roche home. Eugene Fallon, the current owner, opens the door and says to me “Hi, you’re the American.” When I first met Eugene in 2014, I talked to him about my grandmother and her family growing up in Kilbrittain Village around the turn of the twentieth century. Eugene told me he met my grandmother in 1997. Eugene was more than happy to show me around the town, bringing me to the Community Centre to show me a picture of my Great Uncle Ned who I met in 1989, and the school where the Roche family went to get an education.

I’ve been back twice in the last several years and each time Eugene invited me in for coffee and cake. I sent Eugene information about Jack Roche, including his military records, in 2014. He advised me that he gave this information to the Bandon Town Council. So, when Annette Hickey, who is involved with a historical group in Kilbrittain Village, contacted me in November 2016, and asked me to review what she was writing about Jack Roche, she caught me by surprise. She told me that he would be honored with a plaque. Annette said they received my name from a local Cork historian and the owner of Jack’s old house, Eugene. She asked me if I could check the accuracy of dates, edit and add to the information that she had collected, and perhaps secure a picture of Jack as a young man (the only picture they had was when Jack was older). I managed to do all the above. After four months of going back and forth through emails, the following represents the text of Jack Roche’s plaque placed on the wall of his house, next to the house where he and my grandmother were born and raised. I didn’t realize that I would get any credit for the information I provided, but I thought it was pretty cool that my name is printed on the bottom of the plaque, along with the other contributors who helped supply this information.

JACK ROCHE [1902 - 1973]



John [Jack] Roche was born in Kilbrittain in 1902 to Dan [a tailor] and Johanna Roche, oldest in a family of 10. The other family members were Patrick (Pap), Ellen (Nellie), Kate (Kit), Edward (Ned), Jane, Daniel (Dan), Michael, James (Jimmy) and Mary. Jack attended Burren National School. His family was sympathetic to the Republic but none were members of the IRA. Friends encouraged him to join. Although he incurred the disapproval of family, he followed his beliefs and enlisted in the Third West Cork Brigade of the Irish Volunteers. Like many comrades, he was soon on the run, sleeping in caves, bogs and even graveyards. He was captured by Crown Forces and imprisoned in Ballykinlar Camp, Co Down. He took part in a huge number of ambushes and skirmishes during the War of Independence including the 3 attacks on Kilbrittain RIC Station and 2 attacks on the Coastguard Station at Howes Strand. In Nov 1920 he took part in the Kilmichael Ambush and was one of only 5 men who also took part in the Crossbarry Ambush in March 1921. He was wounded in the knee at Kilmichael. He was on the Republican side of the Civil War and was arrested by The Free State in Feb 1923 and released in Dec 1923. He shared a cell with De Valera for some of that time.

After the Troubles, he was refused absolution because of Bishop Coholan’s edict. [In December 1920, Bishop Daniel Cohalan of Cork issued a decree saying that anyone within the diocese of Cork who organised or took part in ambushes or murder or attempted murder would be excommunicated]. This rejection left him greatly troubled and confused. In 1926 he married Margaret Roche and they had 3 children: Donal, James and a third child who unfortunately died in infancy. Jack worked with local farmers, builders and Cork County Council. He won many medals for hurling and football with Kilbrittain GAA and loved singing and dancing and a night out. He was a keen gardener and although he had been wounded in the knee at Kilmichael, gardening became his livelihood in later life.

Each year he attended the commemorations of the ambush and was proud to take the salute with old comrades and friends. He showed no bitterness towards the British. He remained great friends with Tom Barry throughout his life. After Margaret died in 1957, his son Donal and his wife asked him to come and live with them in Liverpool, near their home. He was 70 before the nights sleeping on the damp ground, while on the run, caught up with him. He developed TB and was admitted to a sanatorium. Jack died on the 4th June 1973. In accordance with his wishes, he was buried in Ireland, in the small cemetery of Rathclaren, Kilbrittain not far from where he was born.

2017 Dooley Division Raffle Winner



This year's winner of the 2017 "Trip for Two to Ireland" Raffle is Laura Rossmore. Laura is pictured with her husband and Dooley Division member Ed in a pose which is strikingly similar to last year's photo of the winner. Upon close examination, you will see the date on the check is 2017.

So, what are the odds of the same family winning the raffle twice you may be asking yourself? This is a relatively simple permutation problem to solve based on a couple of assumptions.

1. Ed is a member and bought 10 tickets each year to cover his annual dues.
2. Approximately 2300 tickets were sold each year.

$$10/2300 \times 10/2300 = 1/52,900$$

$$(\#tickets \text{ per family yr } 1 \div \#tickets \text{ sold yr } 1) \times (\#tickets \text{ per family yr } 2 \div \#tickets \text{ sold yr } 2)$$

The odds of the same family winning twice is 1 in 52,900

Odds of the same family winning two consecutive years?

1. Same assumptions as above factoring in the number of consecutive years played. Assume the Rossmores played 5 consecutive years buying 10 tickets each year and approximately 2300 tickets were sold each year.

$$10/2300 \times 10/2300 \times 2/5 = 1/132,250$$

The odds of the same family winning two consecutive years if played 5 consecutive years is 1 in 132,500.
