### Easter Rising Centenary

## the cause:

Ireland was part of the United Kingdom in 1916. The country was ruled day-to-day by a British administration, based in Dublin. Although Ireland had elected representatives, the Irish didn't run the country, and their civil rights had been suppressed by the English for centuries

#### the Rising

On Easter Monday, April 24, 1916, a group of Irish nationalists proclaimed the establishment of the Irish Republic and, along with some 1,600 followers, staged a rebellion against the British government in Ireland. They envisaged a new Ireland as a national democracy; an Ireland which, in the words of their Proclamation, "guarantees religious and civil liberty, equal rights and equal opportunities to all its citizens, and [which] declares its resolve to pursue the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation and all of its parts, cherishing all of the children of the nation equally." They believed that this could only be achieved through complete independence. The rebels seized prominent buildings in Dublin and clashed with British troops.

The long sampation of that right by a foreign people and government has no embrguished the right, nor can a ever be extinguished except by the destruction of the Irish people. In every generation the Irish people have assured their right to national freedom and superviging; six times during the past three handred years they have asserted it in arms. Standing on that fundamental right and again asserting it in arms in the face of the world, we hereby procedum the limit Republic as a Sourcige ford-pendint State, and we pricing our lives and the livest correspondents in arms in the cause of its freedom. of its wrifare, and of its explication among the nations.
