Book review: <u>Irish Nationalists in America: The Politics of Exile 1798-1998</u>, by David Brundage (Oxford University Press 2016). ST BRIGID

February 1st is St Brigid's Day. This iconic woman is one of the most amazing role models in Irish history and yet amazingly many people have forgotten her story. While 'Iconic' and 'role model' are commonly used phrases and may have become trite, their power and meaning are true of this fascinating woman. She is one of three Patron Saints of Ireland, along with St Patrick and St Columcille.

Born in Dundalk in 450 AD, St Brigid was the founder of the first monastery in County Kildare (*Cill Dara*: "church of the oak"). Her mother, a Christian Pict slave, was baptized by Saint Patrick. Brigid's father was a pagan chieftain of Leinster and when she was ten years old, she was a servant fir her father.

St Brigid is also known as Mary of the Gael (*Muire na nGael* (Our Lady of the Irish)). She called on God's help to convince her father to give her land in Kildare to build a convent. Her father said that he would only give her as much land as her cloak could cover. With God's help, the cloak grew to cover acres of land. With that Brigid and seven companions organized a communal, consecrated religious life for women. Also, she founded two monastic institutions, one for men, and the other for women. St Brigid died at the age of 75 in AD 525 and was buried in the church she created. Her remains were exhumed years later and brought to Downpatrick to be buried alongside Saints Patrick and Columcille; however her skull was moved to Lisbon.

JOHN FRANCIS O'MAHONY, FENIAN LEADER

O'Mahony was born in 1816 in Kilbeheny, County Limerick. His father and uncle were members of the United Irishmen and fought in the Irish Rebellion of 1798. He studied Sanskrit, Hebrew and Irish at Trinity College; however, he left Trinity without earning a degree. None the less, he became an accomplished Gaelic scholar, taught Greek and Latin and wrote for Irish and French journals. In 1857 he published *History of Ireland, by Geoffrey Keating, D. D., translated from the Original Gaelic and Copiously Annotated*).

In 1843, he joined Daniel O'Connell's Repeal movement but became dissatisfied with the lack of progress and the required pacifism. He joined *Young Irelander* movement and along with Thomas Francis Meagher took part in the failed Rebellion of 1848. Subsequently, he self-exiled and together with James Stephens, settled in Paris to study the revolutionary tactics of the French revolution. In 1854, O'Mahony moved to New York City where he co-founded (with Michael Doheny) a new Irish revolutionary society, the Robert Emmet Emigrant Aid Association. On St Patrick Day 1858, the Emigrant Aid Association morphed into the Fenian Brotherhood (known as the Irish Republican Brotherhood in Ireland). This association's objective was a free Ireland by any means. O'Mahony's Gaelic studies resulted in name "Fenian" -- a legendary Irish militia.

At the end of the U.S. Civil War a high number of Irish-American soldiers were anxious to see service in the freedom of Ireland. However, British spies and a Fenian schism in 1866 ultimately resulted in another failed Rising in March 1867.



O'Mahony devoted the last years of his life to literary pursuits, but suffered from ill health and poverty. He struggled to maintain bare subsistence. When his poverty was discovered, he declined to receive assistance in any shape.

He died in New York City on February 6, 1877. His remains were taken to Ireland and interred with the honors of a public funeral in Glasnevin Cemetery in Dublin.

- At **informal events** (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets. One source:

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to neck/collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, possibly a raincoat/overcoat (and maybe a growing waist line).
