As we await Opening Day 2020, here's a story that may be of interest: *The Irish Bambino, Roger Connor*, MLB Baseball Hall of Famer, started his career with the Holyoke Shamrocks (*From Irish America*, by Ray Cavanaugh March / April 2020 (edited for space in Dispatches))

In late 1990s baseballs were allegedly juiced as were the sluggers. Players who had been lanky rookies would later display cartoon-sized muscles.

About a century earlier 15 homers could lead the league. In that era the mightiest power-hitter was Roger Connor, a broad-shouldered 6-foot-3 220 pound player who looked the part of a slugger.

He was born in 1857 in Waterbury, Connecticut, one of 11 children and grew up in the Irish neighborhood known as the Abridador district. His father and mother immigrated from County Kerry. Roger left school at a young age and worked with his father. However, his work ethic wasn't consistent as he was spending time playing baseball. Connor's father "had no sympathy for his son's fixation on a game," and Connor received "harsh

retribution” as told by Roy Kerr in *Roger Connor: Home Run King of 19th Century Baseball*.

At age 14, Connor left home for New York, where he worked odd jobs and tried to find a team that would have him.

In 1876 Connor played for the semi-pro Waterbury Monitors. Two years later, he was playing for the Holyoke Shamrocks, where his power-hitting earned him a major league contract with the Troy Trojans. He made his big-league debut on May 1, 1880. His rookie year batting average was .332, but at 3d base in 83 games, he made 60 errors. He was moved to first base in 1881 and his fielding improved but his hitting declined. That year he married Angeline Mayer.

In 1882 Connor was hitting again with a .330 batting average. In 1883 he joined the New York Gothams later renamed the New York Giants and hit .357, second-best in the league. In 1885, Connor’s batting average was .371 and he was one of the league’s best first basemen.

In 1887, he belted a career-high 17 home runs. In 1888 and 1889, Connor played on two New York Giants championship teams. In 1890, he posted a league-

leading 14 home runs and was statistically the league’s best-fielding first baseman. He continued to put up solid numbers in the early 1890s. By 1894 Connor, began to see his playing time reduced, so he joined the St. Louis Browns. In 1896, he was player-manager for the Browns but resigned after a 15-game losing streak.

For his major league career, he batted .316 and had 2,467 hits, including 441 doubles, 233 triples, and 138 home runs (a record for 23 years until Babe Ruth). During his major league career he was never ejected from the game.

He returned to Waterbury and joined the local team in Connecticut’s minor leagues. He was a player-manager and even player-owner before selling his club and retiring from pro baseball at age 46.

He died on January 4, 1931, at age 73, and was buried alongside his wife in an unmarked Waterbury grave. He was forgotten for several decades until Hank Aaron broke Babe Ruth’s career home-run record. The question then was “whose record had Ruth broken?”

In 1976, Connor was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame Yet despite that recognition, his grave remained unmarked until a group of local baseball fans paid for a headstone.

More than 262,000 Vietnam veterans reside in Virginia. Virginians are encouraged to observe this day with ceremonies and activities that promote awareness of the numerous contributions made by Vietnam Veterans.

Sadly, we have seen many “pundits” claim that Irish America no longer exists; low “Irish” response to the Census Ethnic Origins question will only further that belief and see Irish American causes and concerns further deprioritized. *“The first rule of Politics is learning how to count.”* We have recently witnessed an unreasonable delay in the appointment of an ambassador to Ireland. Out of 55,000 Diversity Visas given last year, the entire island of Ireland received 32; compare that to 435 from Fiji. Indian nationals

received over 38,000 employment-based green cards in 2018 and are, as per their right in a democracy, using their political clout to ask for more.

If we as a community don't make an effort to be counted, we will see even less traction on such vital causes as Immigration and Irish Reunification. Far too many of our government educational and cultural institutions already ignore the contribution of the Irish, a low Irish American turnout on the census will give them further justification to do so as "they allocate funds to serve the largest communities."

Many of us were disappointed that we could not make a public statement of our Irish pride this March as St. Patrick's Day Festivities were canceled out of proper concern for the COVID-19 crisis. Let us, therefore, resolve instead this year as a community to celebrate our Irish pride and "say it on the census."

Self Determination in a reunified Ireland – Think Again

Irish Nationalists have been traditionally associated with Catholics, but no more! (Extracted from *Irish Times*, 31 March 2020)

Abortion was decriminalized in Northern Ireland in October 2019 based on legislation passed in the UK parliament. Take a look at how the political entities stack up

Unionist Party: DUP Member of the Northern Ireland Assembly (MLA) Paul Givan said his party wanted to “vote upon the issue and then seek to take forward our own legislation in respect to it”. Mr. Givan said “for many people this is a law which is taking life and which requires an urgent response. We will want to have a motion heard; we will want to seek legislative change so that we have a regime in Northern Ireland that reflects what I believe will be the will of the people on this issue”.

Traditional Unionist Voice leader Jim Allister said that while “the minds of us all at this difficult time are very much focused on the saving of lives, therefore it is all the more abhorrent and perverse that at the very same time we have regulations coming into effect today which will sanction the killing of the unborn”.

Alliance Party: MLA Andrew Muir said the Assembly “had an opportunity to legislate for these issues, and didn’t” as it was not sitting. “This place had an opportunity to affect that change and it failed and we’re a new situation now and I think we have to move forward,” he said.

SDLP: MLA Matthew O’Toole said was glad healthcare for women in Northern Ireland had “evolved to a place where women can access essential services that people in other parts of the UK and now other parts of Ireland can access”.

Sinn Féin: Caoimhe Archibald said it was “only right and proper that woman can access abortion services without having to travel, that they are free to be able to have healthcare in a modern and compassionate way”.

Green Party: MLA Clare Bailey called for telemedicine services to be put in place, as in England and Wales, to allow women to be prescribed abortion pills over the phone and to take them at home.

But keep in mind: The Virginia governor issued Executive Order 55, a 'Stay at Home' order for all Virginians that will last until at least April 30, maybe into the second week of June. Gatherings of more than 10 people can be charged with a Class 1 misdemeanor (fine \$2500 and/or 12 months in jail!). Any business that cannot follow the social distancing order of 10 patrons or fewer is required to close. All elective surgeries have also been postponed. Essentially, Virginians can only leave home for food, supplies, work, medical care, or exercise/fresh air purposes.

On the brighter side, in Germany gatherings of more the 2 people are prohibited.

Also, Virginia ABC stores are essential businesses.

Semi-formal/formal occasions: the AOH “uniform” is green sport coat, tri-color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH State and National conventions, Masses, funerals, AOH dinners, parades, and other public events.

Informal events (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to neck/collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, possibly a raincoat/overcoat (and maybe a growing waistline).
