What Pandemic?


Yes, the General Thomas F. Meagher Division modified fund raising plans for 2020. However, Division brothers working diligently throughout the year raised the funds we needed to meet our charity goals. Tremendous community support for our *Seventh Annual Shamrock Charity Golf Classic* and our *Twelfth Annual Trip for Two to Ireland Raffle* made these efforts remarkable successes. The Golf Classic originally scheduled for early May was eventually played on September 28th at Meadows Farm Golf Course in Locust Grove. Seventy players registered to play and enjoyed 18 holes on a beautiful fall day of competition and camaraderie, followed by a fine steak dinner and

distribution of raffle prizes. We gratefully thank the twenty companies and individuals that sponsored tournament holes and we encourage everyone to patronize our sponsors. They are listed on our website (www.aohfredericksburg.org). The winning foursome consisted of Al Sauter, John Creamer, Michael Paul and Ian Valentine at 25 under par! Second place belonged to the foursome of Rev. John Ziegler, Edwin Hanson, Larry Miller and Chris Talty at 21 under.

Under normal conditions our Trip for Two to Ireland Raffle would kick-off at the Irish American Heritage Month St Patrick Parade and festival in March. The parade and festival were cancelled. Also, in a typical year Hibernians would have been selling tickets after Masses at area churches. Government limits on church attendance created a second challenge. Shawn Lenahan, our raffle chairman innovated and by using the internet and US Postal Service most of the tickets were sold. The winning ticket was drawn on September 19th at the Colonial Tavern – Home to the Irish Brigade and the winner was Sally Black of New Jersey. Because of current travel restrictions Sally opted for the alternate prize of \$2500.00.

Through innovation, patience and exceptional community support the success of our two annual fund raisers have enabled the General Thomas F. Meagher Division to continue its high level of financial support to local charities and to provide scholastic awards to deserving students -- more than \$12,000 this year.

For more than a decade Meagher Division Hibernians have presented a boxwood wreath at the Irish Brigade Memorial located at the Fredericksburg City Dock. Although the National Park Service's formal ceremonies were cancelled this year, to round out the year Gen. Meagher Division brothers assembled at the memorial on December 13th and presented the traditional wreath. Why boxwood? Prior to the fight at Marye's Heights, General Meagher's Irish Brigade placed a bit of green on their kepi. Meagher knew: "It is a moral certainty that many of our countrymen who enlist in this struggle for the maintenance of the Union will fall in the contest. But ... if only one in ten of us come back when the war is over, the military experience gained by that one will be of more service in a fight for Ireland's freedom than would that of the entire ten as they are now."

This plaque depicting the *Poblacht Na h Eireann*, the Irish Proclamation for Independence, was presented to the Gen. Meagher Division recognizing our \$1000 donation to the 2019 Freedom for All Ireland (FFAI) fund. The plaque was handcrafted by former Irish Republican prisoners of war from County Tyrone. The AOH awards grants to groups working for complete and absolute independence, peace and unity for all Ireland. The categories include (a) supporting former Republican political prisoners, (b) truth and justice groups, (c) cross-community initiatives,(d) Irish culture, heritage and language, (e) preserving Irish Republican history, and (f) cross border programs. Groups applying for donations from the FFAI Christmas Appeal, must submit applications that include a question on how they promote freedom for all Ireland. In 2020 grants were awarded to Relatives for Justice, Belfast National Graves, Pat Finucane Centre, Museum of Free Derry, Passionate Peace Centre-Holy Cross Ardoyne, EALU center for Tyrone Republican ex-political prisoners, Green Cross, Tyrone National Graves, Ballymurphy Massacre Families, Greater New Lodge Commemoration Committee, Conway Mill Trust, Cairde Strabane, St. Patrick Centre, Duchas Oiriall-South Armagh, Bridges beyond Boxing, Down Patriot Graves, Omagh Basketball, Omagh Choir, and the Witness Project.

General Meagher Division Attire

Every brother should have these articles of clothing:

Semi-formal/formal occasions: The AOH "uniform" is green sport coat, tri-color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH Masses, funerals, dinners, parades, State and National conventions, and other public events.

Informal events (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets. One source: http://blazerdepot.com/pages/mens_blazer/augustagreenblazer.html. Visit the website; call the 800 number; tell them you're with AOH and the \$5.00 small order fee can be waived. Kelly green is the color.

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to neck/collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip

in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, possibly a raincoat/overcoat (and maybe a growing waistline).
