U.S. Special Envoy to Northern Ireland

This critical position was vacant for three years until the appointment of Mick Mulvaney in March 2020. Special Envoy Mulvaney resigned on 7 January 2021 and so, it is vacant once again. Today, the position is as critical as in was in 1997-98 when George Mitchell chaired negotiations resulting in the Good Friday Agreement. Now, as BREXIT is finalized and Irish internal relationships and the island's connection to the European Union are being established, the U.S. voice in Irish negotiations may be more important.

The Celt would forfeit his title to the respect of the civilized world, did he not fight with all his heart and all his soul and all his cunning against the empire which has despoiled him and murdered his kin, now with arms, now with artificial famine. There can be no peace between the two people until either Ireland is a desert or is free. There can be neither truce nor compromise.



You probably thought the meaning has to do with extreme good fortune, but originally the phrase had a different connotation. According to Edward T. O'Donnell, an Associate Professor of History at Holy Cross College, the term is not Irish in origin.

During the gold and silver rush years in the late 19th century, a number of the most famous and successful miners were Irish and Irish-Americans. Over time this association of the Irish with mining fortunes led to the expression ***"Luck of the Irish"***. ***But***, it was a derisive term intimating only by sheer luck, as opposed to brains and ability, could these Irish fools succeed. (Makes me wonder if the confusion between the Irish shamrock and the four leaf clover symbol of good luck, is tied in there somewhere?)



Irish American Heritage Month

For decades, the Meagher Division has created awareness and celebrated IAHM with an annual St Patrick Day parade, an Irish festival, presentations spanning three weeks in local libraries, and speaking engagements hosted by other fraternal groups (VFW, etc.). In past years we've collaborated with Blue & Grey Brewery, A. Smith Bowman Distillery, the Colonial Tavern – home to the Irish Brigade and the National Park Service.

As was the case in 2020, none of the "routine" IAHM activities will be possible in 2021. So, we've sought alternatives. The Free Lance Star has agreed to publish one article in the Communities Section and another on the Opinion page. These are under construction at this time. Also, although we cannot be physically present at the local libraries, they will feature IAHM, will review content we'd like to share for their blog, and have solicited our recommendations for a booklist .

General Meagher Division Attire

Every brother should have these articles of clothing:

Semi-formal/formal occasions: The AOH “uniform” is green sport coat, tri-color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH Masses, funerals, dinners, parades, State and National conventions, and other public events.

Informal events (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets. One source: http://blazerdepot.com/pages/mens_blazer/augustagreenblazer.html. Visit the website; call the 800 number; tell them you're with AOH and the \$5.00 small order fee can be waived. Kelly green is the color.

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to neck/collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, possibly a raincoat/overcoat (and maybe a growing waistline).
