#### Looking Back at 2021

In spite of the Virus and mandated suspension of in-person meetings for six months, your Division was active raising money to support our charities and moving forward on multiple avenues. All brothers can be proud of these accomplishments!

We innovated in March because in-person IAHM activities were not possible. We augmented the Central Rappahannock Regional Library website with a reading list and with links to national and organizational websites featuring Irish heritage, traditions, and customs.



In August many of us attended the 23d Virginia AOH Biennial Convention in Richmond. There we celebrated Edwin Hanson's election to the AOH State Board as Treasurer. Edwin is added to the list of dedicated Hibernian leaders who have emerged from the General Meagher Division since 1987.

We followed this with a Virus sensitive low key Halfway to St Patrick Day party at the Colonial Tavern and the culmination of our 13<sup>th</sup> annual Trip for Two to Ireland raffle. We sold more than 1200 opportunities to win and gratefully thank all who participated ... but there's only one winner and this year we congratulated Mark Black on winning the raffle!



Seventy-five golfers enjoyed great day of camaraderie in our 8<sup>th</sup> Annual Shamrock Charity Golf Classic played at Lake of the Woods Country Club. After golf, we enjoyed a "gourmet" luncheon of prime rib with all the fixings, including delicious chocolate cake. Mike McCraw, Terry Sindt, and Rick McInnis were on the winning team. Revenue from the raffle and golf tourney supports our charities. In 2021 we donated more than \$2200 to local Pro-Life organizations (Birthright, Paul-Stefan, and Mary's Shelter) and an equal amount to diocesan workcamps conducted by our four parishes. We provided \$3000 in scholastic awards (financial assistance) to students entering local Catholic high schools and \$400 for Irish history books donated to St Michael the Archangel and The Summit school libraries. Further, \$2700 was donated to various parish projects, including recognition of Fathers Schierer's (10<sup>th</sup>) and Ziegler's (25<sup>th</sup>) ordination anniversaries and \$2,000 to Irish charities (FFAI/Irish Cultural Center).

Later in September the Gen. Meagher Division welcomed our Chaplain Deacon Aaron Zaccagnino; the division learned who was selected as the 2019 and 2020 division Hibernians of the Year (Jack Grey and Shawn Lenihan); remembered 23 deceased brothers at our annual Memorial Mass; honored Irishman who fought and died in the Battle of Fredericksburg by placing a wreath at the Irish Brigade monument; and...

RIVERDANCE!

Editor's Note: In 1995 Riverdance opened at the Hammersmith Apollo theater in London. At the time I was serving as U.S. Army Attaché at our Embassy in London and had the good fortune of attend a performance at the Hammersmith Apollo. In subsequent years, as a volunteer usher at Wolf Trap Lisa and I enjoyed at least five more performances. *It never gets old!* (Some of you may remember the young man (Jason?) dancing with the Muggivan School at our 2018 Halfway Dinner Party. He was selected to tour with the company.)

Since June 1995, an estimated 25 million people have seen this remarkable Irish box office sensation in venues all over the world. Back then nobody could have predicted just how big the worldwide Riverdance phenomena would be.

The origins of this epic achievement could not have been more inauspicious. In the mid-90s Ireland had a curious winning streak on Eurovision. This meant RTE had to create another TV spectacular. Executive TV producer Moya Doherty was tasked with producing something special and different for the 180 million TV viewers.

This was to be a seven-minute interval slot always a problem but Moya was determined to find something fresh that would reflect this hubris surrounding the emergence of the Celtic Tiger. Moya had seen Jean Butler a 23-year-old student dance when she performed on the Chieftains tours and the 34-year-old American Michael Flatley dance. Both were exceptional talents and in an act of creative genius Moya put the two of them together to dance for Eurovision. She commissioned composer Bill Whelan to develop a score for this interval slot and Riverdance was born.

Viewers expecting a clichéd montage of Celtic images of 'auld Ireland' were stopped in their tracks by the stunning impact of that battalion of hard shoe dancers proudly pounding the stage and the unbelievable agility of Butler and Flatley soaring through the air. This was a ground-breaking performance exuding a strictly one-way sexual frisson between the two as they jousted with each other with their impeccably choreographed speed dial steps.

After the Eurovision show, Moya Doherty and her husband John put all their energies into extending their seven minute segment into a full stage show and literally banked their house on the huge risk as they tried to get others to invest. The first actual full length Riverdance show opened the next year on February 9, 1995. After that sell-out Dublin run it transferred to London and it became absolutely clear that this was a spectacle not limited to an Irish audience but was a full-blown international stage success story that could travel the world.

Now, the show is enjoying its 25th anniversary tour. Hampered by Covid-19 last year it is now in full swing. If you think after 26 years Riverdance might be just going through the motions, think again! This re-imagined Riverdance, with this young energetic new cast, most not born when the original was staged, are an absolutely brilliant world-class production.

As generations of young people were inspired to start Irish dancing over the years, the show is now full of exceptional talents who perform the precisely choreographed routines with amazing athleticism and dancing skills. After 26 years the show has lost nothing as a dance spectacular and it has actually vastly improved. It is no surprise then that Riverdance is booked across the world into 2023.

Every brother should have these articles of clothing:

Semi-formal/formal occasions: The AOH "uniform" is green sport coat, tri-color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH Masses, funerals, dinners, parades, State and National conventions, and other public events.

Informal events (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

Division Logo Items: Point of Contact for Division logo polo shirts, sweatshirts and ball caps is Shawn Lenahan (s_lenahan@verizon.net)

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets. One source: http://blazerdepot.com/pages/mens_blazer/augustagreenblazer.html. Visit the website; call the 800 number; tell them you're with AOH and the \$5.00 small order fee can be waived. Kelly green is the color.

AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline).
