- ✓ <u>6 June D-Day</u>: The battle for Pointe du Hoc became one of the most heroic moments of the D-Day invasion. - ✓ 14 June: U.S. Army's 247th Birthday and Flag Day: The Office of Strategic Services (OSS) was the military intelligence agency during World War II. In September 1945 President Truman disbanded OSS and transferred OSS operations to the Army. To execute the mission, Special Forces was formed in 1952 and trained to conduct counterinsurgency, unconventional warfare, special reconnaissance and related missions. In 1953 the Army established a paramilitary capability and trained them to obtain intelligence not available other means. Both elements adapted OSS doctrine. - ✓ 20 June is Father's Day: Sonora Smart Dodd, one of six children raised by a widower, worked to establish an official equivalent to Mother's Day for male parents. She was successful as Washington State celebrated the first Father's Day on June 19, 1910. It became a nationwide holiday in the United States in 1972.

Hibernian Longevity Recognition



Brother Gene McKenna, a USMC veteran, joined the AOH in Danbury, CT in September 1970 and received our Order's Major Degrees in 1974. In Danbury Gene was honored as the Division Hibernian of the Year. When his career brought him to Virginia and to Lake of the Woods, Gene transferred into the Gen. Thomas F. Meagher Division where he served as Recording Secretary and was a prime mover in Division outreach and fund raising initiatives. He could always be counted on to achieve Hibernian goals and polish the image of our division in the public square. As an example, Gene authored a poem lauding Gen. Thomas F. Meagher Division accomplishments and presented it at the Richmond Virginia Biennial Convention. His dedication earned him a second Hibernian of the Year Award in 2015.

On May 17th Gen. Meagher Division President Bob Fitzgerald presented Gene with a Hibernian pin recognizing his 50 (plus) years as an outstanding Hibernian.

Three brothers recognized for 25 years were: PSP/PDP Bill Halpin who joined AOH in 1983 (interrupted by consecutive overseas postings); Battalion Chief Jack McGovern, Fredericksburg Fire Dept. who joined in 1992; and Captain Patrick McGroarty, USN, who joined in 1997.

Ancient Order of Hibernians to Vote on Allowing Female Members From <u>Irish America</u> Magazine, 28 Mat 2022

The Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH) is set to vote on whether to allow female <u>members</u> in July. The historic conference was announced after the AOH, which is the largest fraternal Irish organization in the U.S., experienced a 20% drop in membership over the last decade.

The organization will revisit its long-standing male-only policy at a conference in Pennsylvania this summer. However, opposition to the proposal comes from the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians (LAOH), which says the move would be detrimental to its organization. The LAOH, which is completely separate from the AOH following a tax audit in 2012, has argued that female members of the AOH would not be treated as equal members of the organization.

Daniel O'Connell, the current national president of the AOH, told the *Irish Times* he is "hopeful the LAOH leadership and membership moving forward will embrace a proposal that would give women residing in America another opportunity to embrace their Irish heritage."

The decline in AOH membership is thought to be due to aging members while some current members believe that younger men are reluctant to join an organization that does not permit female members.

Currently, AOH members must be male, Catholic, and able to prove Irish ancestry, according to the organization's constitution. The group currently boasts 30,000 members while the LAOH reports just over 10,000.



Division President Bob Fitzgerald submitted "Shamrocks are clovers, but not all clovers are shamrocks"

The word "shamrock" comes from the Gaelic word *Seamrog*, meaning "little clover"¹. As you all know, one of the traditional Irish symbols is a shamrock, and a shamrock appears on the flag of Erin Go Bragh, meaning "Ireland Forever", and Saint Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity with the three leaves representing the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. A shamrock can be found on the uniforms of Irish sports teams and on the tail of the national airline, Aer Lingus.

The use of the shamrock as Ireland's national symbol dates back thousands of years, but there appears to be confusion in today's world about what constitutes a traditional shamrock. By definition, a shamrock is a clover that specifically has three leaves, no more and no less. Do not confuse a shamrock with a four-leafed clover, which is NOT a shamrock. Some researchers note that the Druids (priests of the ancient Celts) claimed that a four-leafed clover was a good luck charm against evil spirits. These days, most people have forgotten about the "evil spirits" part and just remember that they are supposed to be good luck, and perhaps somehow confused that with the "luck of the Irish". You may find four-leaf, five-leaf, or even six-leaf clovers as a result of a genetic abnormality...but none of these abnormal clovers are shamrocks.

Every brother should have these articles of clothing

Semi-formal/formal occasions: The AOH "uniform" is green sport coat, tri-color sash, white shirt, Irish theme tie, black trousers and optional ball cap. These occasions include AOH Masses, funerals, dinners, parades, State and National conventions, and other public events.

Informal events (i.e. Division outings (ball games, picnics, meetings, etc.) the division logo polo or sweatshirts (optional ball cap) are appropriate.

Division Logo Items: Point of Contact for Division logo polo shirts, sweatshirts and ball caps is Shawn Lenahan (<u>s_lenahan@verizon.net</u>)

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets. One source: <u>http://blazerdepot.com/pages/mens_blazer/augustagreenblazer.html</u>. Visit the website; call the 800 number; tell them you're with AOH and the \$5.00 small order fee can be waived. Kelly green is the color. AOH Sash: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline). Sashes are available from: **D. & E.
