
The Free Lance Star's 14 December edition carried an excellent account Mali Lucas-Green's family history. Her great grandfather, a mule driver for the Confederate army crossed the Rappahannock with his family to escape slavery as Lee's army was preparing defensive positions at the sunken road on Marye's Heights. This was a feat of desperation and courage. It reminded of my mid-19th century antecedents risking everything in crossing the Atlantic Ocean to escape the oppression of English dominance in Ireland.

Lucas-Greens' account was an important contribution to Fredericksburg recognition of the 160th Anniversary of the Battle of Fredericksburg. On December 11th, a small gathering watched as General Thomas F. Meagher Division brothers, the 28th Massachusetts Volunteer Infantry Regiment re-enactors, and members of the Irish Brigade Camp No.4 presented wreaths at the Irish Brigade memorial located close to the Rappahannock City Dock where the Irish Brigade crossed the river. This was a quiet and solemn display honoring the incredible bravery and determination in the fight for the Union at Fredericksburg. The irony on this anniversary was the remarkable absence of the National Park Service. For many years NPS historian Frank O'Reilly added important context to the day as he recounted General Meagher exhortation as his soldiers prepared for battle. This year the NPS decided not to honor the Irish Brigade, but instead chose to honor the 7th West Virginia Regiment which lost 51 soldiers killed, wounded or missing at Marye's Heights. According to one NPS ranger (not O'Reilly), a decision was made to honor other units from year-to-year. Who knows when balance will be restored to the universe.

HALFWAY TO ST. PATRICK'S DAY **EVENT RETURNS**

EVENT RETURNS After a two-year pandemic hiatus, the General T. F. Mea-gher Division, Ancient Order of Hibernians in America and Colonial Tavern will host the 12th annual Halfway to St. Patrick Day Celebration on Sept. 17, 11:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Live music will be provided by DragonFyre and Sibling Rivalry, Irish dancers from the Muggivan School of Irish Dance will perform, Irish food specials will be half price, a limited number of commemorative mugs filled with an Irish beverage will be available for purchase, and the winner of the 14th annual Trip for Two to Ireland raffle will be drawn. The lucky win-ner will choose between the six-day trip or the alternate cash prize of \$2,500. There's no admission charge.

It's official -- after two years President Biden has finally appointed a Special Envoy to the north of Ireland. Joe Kennedy III, grandson of Bobby Kennedy, was appointed as "Special Envoy to Northern Ireland for Economic Affairs". This came as a surprise to many who considered former congressman Bruce Morrison a better candidate. But, like everything else, this appointment is about American politics. Appointing Joe Kennedy provides him with a platform to launch his political future. The "for economic affairs" caveat is the same title George Mitchel was given when appointed in 1995. President Biden plans to visit the north of Ireland in the April-May timeframe to mark the 25th anniversary of the Good Friday Agreements.

On Irish matters, it seems Massachusetts rules. Former member of the Massachusetts House of Representatives Claire Cronin is now U.S. Ambassador and former Massachusetts congressman Kennedy is our Special Envoy. As an aside, Massachusetts Gov. Charlie Baker will be the next NCAA president.

December Trivia Question: In the USA the term "plantation" is commonly used to describe large tracts of farming and grazing land. What is the origin of the term?

ANSWER: In the 16th century the English confiscated Irish owned lands as a means of controlling and anglicizing the Irish. The English "transplanted" loyalist Protestants from England and Scotland to Ireland where they assumed ownership of the confiscated lands. The transplanted called the lands "plantations". This fundamentally changed Irish culture primarily in Ulster, but elsewhere as well.

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets -- Kelly green is the color.

<u>AOH Sash</u>: Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline). Sashes are available from:
