Division Administration:

Quorum: This is the minimum number of brothers that must be present at meetings to make the proceedings of that meeting valid. Without a quorum the division cannot vote on critical issues, administer the Shamrock Degree, elect officers, pay bills, or approve the minutes of previous meetings. We need you to attend in person or, if needed, virtually using the Internet connection

provided with the "Call to Meeting" alerts. Our meetings are to the point, generally lasting one hour and followed by a social time with snacks and beverages.

IMPORTANT CHANGE FOR 2025 DUES: At the November 2024 meeting our brothers unanimously voted to increase our annual dues to \$50 for brothers who have not yet celebrated their 75th birthday. As required in division by-laws, brothers 75 and older pay state and national per capita (\$21), an amount that can change year -to-year. The increase was deemed to be necessary as administrative costs have increased, e.g. state and national per capita taxes, cost of pins, name badges, stamps, etc. Reminder, 2025 dues are payable now!

<u>Volunteerism</u>: All Hibernians volunteer to join our Brotherhood. We all pledge our "sacred word and honor" to be zealous in supporting the interests of the General Meagher Division. Certainly, many of us have obligations to family, employment, church, etc. However, when something truly matters to us, as Hibernians we'll always find the time to do it. Good examples of division events requiring participation include the annual Memorial Mass, commemorating the Irish Brigade/Battle of Fredericksburg, Irish American Heritage Month, and the Annual Halfway to St. Patrick Day . "Showing up" for these events will take about two hours' time and are effective, public displays of our motto.

Fund Raising: The Division has two major fundraising activities each year.

1. The <u>Annual Shamrock Charity Golf Classic</u> will be played at Lake of the Woods on April 28, 2025. Success requires every brother's (non-golfer too) commitment for some time and some effort.

- Starting now! Every brother has doctors, dentists, favorite restaurants, and commercial venders. Each one of these can be a hole sponsor for our tournament, or at least can donate something (dinner for two?) for our raffle. For hole sponsors, we'll place signage on the golf course that acknowledges the donation and advertises the sponsor. All supporters are noted on our website. Hole Sponsorship will cost about \$125.00
- On April 28th: Volunteers (about 3-4r hours' time) is needed to assist in placing/retrieving sponsors' signage at tee boxes, registering golfers, selling items to enhance the golf experience ("red tees", lengths of string, etc.), and placing "goody bags" on golf carts.

2. The <u>Annual Trip for Two to Ireland Raffle</u> also requires a commitment to sell <u>at least</u> 15 raffle tickets. We also need volunteers to sell tickets after Mass at one of our four parishes. Ideally, we need at least two brothers per church per Mass. The parish liaison will arrange sales dates (two weekends per parish usually in June and August) and ask for your help.

3. In Summary: The General Meagher Division membership is 55 brothers. With minimal effort by every brother, we could sell 900 raffle tickets (\$7500) and 110 hole sponsors (\$13,200!). Keep in mind this money is distributed to our charities.

#### **Old House Tour**

On November 1<sup>st</sup> several brothers and one spouse toured the Old House Winery and discovered there is more than expected at this vineyard. Ryan Kearney, Old House CEO led the group. First stop was the winery and then on to the distillery and whiskey bar, and later the "beer hall", and finally the Irish Pub.

The group learned about the history of the vineyard and how the production of wines led to the distilling aspect. The distillery produces excellent corn whiskey (of this I know first-hand), Rum, Spiced Rum, and a Rum/Coffee; Virginia version of a Tequila, Vodka, and Grog (from the "original recipe"). The distillery tasting room is really a museum created and decorated to honor of our World War II Veterans.



The "Tap Room" (aka beer hall) is adjacent to the Irish Pub. It is worthy to note the Old House brews its own beers as well -- IPAs, Stouts, and Lagers.

#### **Annual Memorial Mass**

**On November 18**<sup>th</sup> eleven brothers remembered our deceased brothers at a Mass celebrated by Father John Ziegler, pastor at beautiful St. Patrick Church. Ellis Island closed om Nov 12, 1954. From 1892 – 1954, over two million Irish immigrants entered the U.S. through Ellis Island. The first recorded immigrant was 14 year old Annie Moor from Co. Cork.

It was the busiest immigrant inspection and processing station in the United States. Nearly 12 million<u>immigrants</u> arriving at the <u>Port\_of</u> New York and New Jersev were processed Located in New York Harbor, it is the most famous and historically important gateway and is home to one of the country's most moving museums. It pays tribute to the indelible courage of more than 12 million immigrants who passed through the station after journeys that often took weeks and months under difficult conditions. More than 100 million living Americans are the descendants of these arrivals who hoped to attain the American dream for themselves and their children.

Green Jacket: Brothers procure their own green jackets -- Kelly green is the color.

**AOH Sash:** Brothers procure their own sashes. The AOH tri-color sash represents the national colors of Ireland and should be worn over the right shoulder (green closest to collar) crossing to the left hip. Measure from right shoulder to left hip in inches; keep in mind the sash will normally be worn over a jacket, a raincoat/overcoat (and a growing waistline). Sashes are available from:
