### Catholic Church Under Attack (again):

1. **Washington State Gov.** Bob Ferguson signed a bill that explicitly eliminates legal protections for the sacred seal of Catholic confession in abuse-related cases. Bill 5375 passed the Senate 64-31 and the House 28-20. The law takes effect July 27.

This is the first law with direct legislative intent to remove legal protections for clergy-penitent confidentiality. Breaking the seal of confession is considered a grave offense, punishable by automatic excommunication.

On May 2 Bishop Thomas Daly of Spokane wrote: “I want to assure you that your shepherds, bishop and priests, are committed to keeping the seal of confession – even to the point of going to jail. The Sacrament of Penance is sacred and will remain that way in the Diocese of Spokane.” He added “For those legislators who question our commitment to the safety of your children, simply speak with any mom who volunteers with a parish youth group, any Catholic school teacher, any dad who coaches a parochial school basketball team or any priest, deacon or seminarian, and you will learn first-hand about our solid protocols and procedures.” Source: *Washington State Standard*.

2. **FBI files show targeting of Catholic groups**; by Kerry Picket - *The Washington Times* - Tuesday, June 3, 2025 (*edited here for space*)

Newly revealed bureau documents show the FBI concealed the extent of its anti-Catholic operation, which then-FBI Director Christopher A. Wray told Congress was limited to a single 2023 memo,

FBI files obtained by Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Charles E. Grassley show the FBI engaged in a bureau-wide investigation of “Radical Traditionalist Catholics.” The new documents show the Richmond memo dated Jan. 23, 2023 was distributed to more than 1,000 FBI employees nationwide. The memo was an alert that “Radical Traditionalist Catholics” adhere to an “anti-Semitic, anti-immigrant, anti-LGBTQ and white supremacist ideology” and said these Catholics are prone to “extremist ideological beliefs and violent rhetoric.” Two Catholic groups included in the memo were sourced to the Southern Poverty Law Center as “hate groups”.

The newly revealed documents show that the Richmond field office worked with the FBI office in Louisville, Ky to gather information about Catholic traditionalist groups there. FBI analysts in Richmond also consulted with the Portland, Oregon, and Milwaukee field offices as they prepared the memo. At least 13 additional FBI documents and five FBI attachments used the terminology “radical traditionalist Catholic”.

In testimony on March 8, 2023, before the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence, Mr. Wray said he was “aghast” when he first learned about the memo and that the bureau “took steps immediately to withdraw it and remove it from FBI systems.” Mr. Wray did not reveal the existence of a second draft product on the same topic intended for external distribution to the entire FBI. According to the new documents, that draft product was intended for distribution as a Strategic Perspective Executive Analytic Report (SPEAR). “It was clearly a separate product ... and for ... different distribution to the whole Bureau” and with chain of review, through the Counterterrorism Division. Mr. Grassley said. “Nevertheless, this draft external memo repeated the unfounded link between traditional Catholicism and violent extremism”.

### **2025 Scholastic Awards**

The journal of the Continental Congress recorded this for June 14<sup>th</sup> 1775:

"Resolved,

That six companies of expert riflemen, be immediately raised in Pennsylvania, two in Maryland, and two in Virginia; that each company consist of a captain, three lieutenants, four sergeants, four corporals, a drummer or trumpeter, and sixty-eight privates.

That each company, as soon as completed, shall march and join the army near Boston, to be there employed as light infantry, under the command of the chief Officer in that army."

The Continental Congress prescribed the oath for enlisting Continental troops: "I have, this day, voluntarily enlisted myself, as a soldier, in the American continental army, for one year, unless sooner discharged: And I do bind myself to conform, in all instances, to such rules and regulations, as are, or shall be, established for the government of the said Army."

The National Museum of the U.S. Army at Fort Belvoir has a special exhibit to mark the 250th.

On 14 June a military parade in Washington D.C. commemorated the Army's 250th birthday. The parade included reenactors and equipment from major U.S. battles from the Revolutionary War, Civil War, Spanish-American War, World War I, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, Gulf War/Desert Storm and the War on Terror. Active-duty service members and cadets at U.S. military academies participated.



#### **Decoration Day, May 30<sup>th</sup>:**

### Terminology Matters

The Government of Ireland does not officially recognize the term "British Isles" as a political unit. "Britain and Ireland" should be used, or as an alternative description we can use "**North Atlantic Archipelago**" which is becoming popular in academia. In official documents created jointly by Ireland and the United Kingdom, such as the Good Friday Agreement, the term "these islands" is used.

### Ireland Reunification

June 2025, Belfast: Research conducted annually by Queen's University and Ulster University show of the 18-24 year-olds questioned, 48% back unification, compared to 30% who are opposed to constitutional change and 12% who don't know. The research also indicates a majority of people – some 61% – are convinced Ireland will be united within 20 years, with just 16% believing the region's constitutional status won't change.

“We are celebrating the unique and very important bond that the Choctaw and the Irish share,” said Sandy Vigil, Director of Education at the Choctaw Cultural Center. “We had just finished coming over on the Trail of Tears ourselves. We had suffered many of the same things that the Irish had suffered: including colonization, being pushed out of our homelands, and even though we were still suffering and still recovering from this trauma, a group of Choctaws came together and they donated \$170 to our Irish friends.”
